

UNDERSTANDING SEXUAL CONSENT

Consent is an agreement between people to engage in sexual activity. Sexual activity is something to be done with someone, not to someone. Consent is a critical part of this process and must be freely given, informed and mutual.

However, if you don't have consent, it is a criminal offence. Sexual assault is any unwanted behaviour of a sexual nature that makes a person feel uncomfortable, scared or threatened. Sexual negotiation can be a difficult or awkward process for anyone, regardless of age, to navigate. How do young people negotiate safe sexual contact together? What personal and societal pressures may contribute to non-consensual sex, and how do we promote a respectful culture of consent? Learn how to clearly define consent and to understand the personal and legal consequences of sexual assault. It is always better to be safe than sorry, to communicate with care and respect, and to uphold consent above conquest.

Fresh water is our most precious resource; its scarcity is one of our greatest threats. The recent drought in Eastern Australia – where Sydney experienced severe drought, while towns across New South Wales and Queensland ran out of drinking water – demonstrates our exposure to

water scarcity. A recent Productivity Commission report found Australia's blueprint for water reform, the National Water Initiative, is not fit for the challenges of climate change and our growing population. How can Australia achieve greater progress in water reform and improve the allocation of water resources through fairer water trading rights and new infrastructure projects, preserve the Murray-Darling Basin for food security, address advancing climate change, acknowledge Indigenous rights to water, deliver decent drinking water to all Australians, and ensure adequate drought management plans are in place around the country? We need to manage our water well into the future, before we are down to the last few drops.

There are lots of ways to describe sexuality and gender, a number of which are captured by the term LGBTQIA+. Many LGBTQIA+ people face discrimination and prejudice that can affect their health, wellbeing, rights and opportunities. This book explores a range of issues across the sexual identity and gender diversity spectrum, including issues such as coming out and disclosure, being an ally to LGBTQIA+ people, and addressing the human rights of the LGBTQIA+ members of our community. Every night 116,000 Australians are homeless, lacking safe, secure or affordable housing. This includes rough sleepers, people staying in temporary accommodation, and those sharing with others in severely crowded dwellings. Homelessness has profound effects on various

social groups including struggling families, young people, women escaping domestic violence, older women, Indigenous Australians, and people with substance abuse and mental health problems. The homelessness problem is growing, in spite of 300,000 Australians already receiving help from specialist homelessness services each year. Most rough sleepers were temporarily housed by governments during the early stages of the COVID-19 pandemic but they are now back on the streets fending for themselves. What can governments do to properly address the homeless epidemic? How could more emergency housing, supported accommodation, private rental housing, and long-term affordable and social housing better meet demand for essential shelter? Currently there is a boom in house prices in Australia – but what about the overlooked plight of the homeless?




FUTURE OF TRANSPORT

Recent advances in technology have revolutionised how we all connect and communicate – so what does the future of transport look like? Transport is the second largest source of greenhouse gas emissions in Australia, a country with a heavy reliance on fossil-fuelled cars

ASYLUM SEEKERS AND REFUGEES

Australia has a long history of successfully resettling refugees and humanitarian entrants who have been forced to flee from their country of origin, however in recent years our treatment of asylum seekers has been under a spotlight. Controversial policies include offshore processing and harsh mandatory

immigration detention, restricted community detention, resettling refugees in other countries, and temporary protection visas which leave people in limbo for years. Although there have been no boat arrivals in the last few years, the COVID-19 pandemic has drastically curtailed an already limited intake of refugees. The legacy caseload of boat arrivals has also created challenges, leaving over 30,000 people living in the community who have made applications for protection visas, but are left on bridging visas for several years, with some work rights, but no access to Centrelink, or the right to study. What is the experience of asylum seekers and refugees in Australia? Does Australia fully comply with its international obligations under the *Refugee Convention*, including humane reception conditions and a fair, efficient and transparent system for processing asylum claims?



INDIGENOUS HEALTH AND WELLBEING

Indigenous Australians have endured a history of colonisation that has profoundly affected their health and wellbeing. For First Nations people, good health goes beyond the absence of disease and illness; it is a holistic concept that includes

physical, social, emotional, cultural and spiritual wellbeing, for both the individual and community. In 2020, all governments committed to new targets to improve the lives of Indigenous people, after the failure of the previous Closing the Gap scheme. Indigenous burden of disease is 2.3 times that of non-Indigenous Australians; rates of psychological distress and chronic diseases are higher; there are disparities across education, housing, employment and income; access to health services is often limited and not culturally appropriate. This book also examines the factors which underpin the foundations for effectively tackling indigenous health and disadvantage: holistic health and wellbeing; social determinants of health; and cultural determinants of health. We have 17 new Closing the Gap targets. Will governments now do what is needed to meet them?

The concept of a 'traditional nuclear family' has been changing in recent decades. Trends in divorce and remarriage have contributed to more one-parent and re-partnered parent families, while the number

of couple families in Australia without children is projected to overtake couple families with children

to become the most common family type during the next decade. More young people are also choosing to stay at home and live with their parents in their early adulthood. Multigenerational household living arrangements are quietly emerging in Australia. Mum, dad and two kids is no longer the norm in the changing Australian family. Family processes such as parenting quality, parental wellbeing, and relationship satisfaction within the family – rather than traditional family structures – appear to meaningfully impact more on children's wellbeing and positive development. This book explores family trends, changes and diversity, featuring a range of family types including single parent families, step and blended families, rainbow and same-sex families. It also examines the quality of family relationships, and the challenges families face in the modern age.

Youth offending has fallen across most jurisdictions in Australia over the past decade, in step with crime in general. However, young people entering the youth justice system are a vulnerable population group who are likely to have a number of complex needs and come from challenging

backgrounds including dysfunctional family environments, unstable accommodation or homelessness, socio-economic disadvantage and poverty. This group is also more likely to be struggling with alcohol and substance misuse, mental health issues, cognitive disabilities, childhood abuse and neglect, and disrupted education. This book examines the latest youth crime data and explores key issues that have been the focus of youth justice system inquiries in recent years including: tough-on-crime policies aimed at young people; the detrimental impacts of youth justice detention; Indigenous over-representation; raising the minimum age of criminal responsibility from 10 to 14 years of age; detention as a last resort and the diversionary alternatives; and improving programs in detention. Is 'doing the time for the crime' real justice when it comes to children and young people?

Young Australians are disproportionately vulnerable to experiencing self-harm and suicide. Self-harm, or self-injury, is often done in secret and is most common in young people aged 11-25 years as a means of trying to cope. In Australia,

suicide is the leading cause of death for males and females aged between 15 and 44; tragically, around 3,000 people in Australia each year take their own lives. For every suicide, there are ripple effects for friends, families and the wider community. We can all play a role in preventing suicide by looking out for possible warning signs, reaching out, and talking about it. This title explores risk factors, warning signs and responses to self-harming and suicidal behaviours. Prevention strategies are explained, focusing on help-seeking and enhancing protective factors. Self-harm and suicide prevention requires coordinated action from governments, health care, community workers, workplaces, schools and other educational settings, and the media, as well as individuals, families and communities. Learn how to cope, with more help and support. Young lives should be lived well.


